Health Statement

Dogs adopted from K-9 Stray Rescue League are guaranteed to be provided certain standard vaccines and tests as part of his or her adoption fee. These include, but are not limited to,

- a rabies shot
- a distemper/corona shot
- a heartworm test (if old enough)
- a heartworm preventative (while we have the dog)
- a spay/neuter
- a fecal test to determine the presence of any worms/parasites

Everything your specific dog has been provided is recorded on a blue sheet which you will find in the folder that comes with your dog.

You will need to provide certain additional health care for your dog at your own expense including, but not limited to,

- additional distemper/corona shots to fully vaccinate him/her (if your vet recommends it)
- a monthly heartworm preventative (preferably given year round)
- all future annual vaccines and test
- treatment of any medical conditions that may arise

Worms (round, hook, whip and tape) are common in dogs and usually very easy to treat. Kennel cough is also common and often requires minimal treatment if any at all. Any treatment for worms and/or kennel cough will be your responsibility. We make no guarantees as to the general health of your pet but in all cases you have the option of returning your dog per the terms of the adoption contract you signed.

There is a considerable amount of expense involved (\$150 or more on routine medical alone) every year in keeping your dog healthy even if it never has a serious health issue. Please keep this in mind when deciding to take on the responsibility of owning a dog.
